## This Weeks's Pursuit: Crystallization Study of Leviticus, Week 04

The Vision and Enjoyment of the Meal Offering

Scripture Reading: Lev. 2:1-16; 6:14-23; John 6:57, 63; 12:24; 1 Cor. 10:17

## The Vision and Enjoyment of the Meal Offering

The **meal offering** in particular typifies three things: Christ in His God-man living, our Christian life as a duplication of Christ in His God-man living, and the church life -- a corporate living by the perfected God-men.

The meal offering spoken of in Lev. 2:1-16 is a type of Christ in His God-man living. The meal offering was of **fine flour** on which **oil** was poured, and **frankincense**, and also **salt**; it was to be baked in the oven, unleavened, and anointed with oil. **Each detail** of the meal offering is a type of Christ in His Godman living, and as we prayerfully consider these aspects, we will see a Christ we have never seen before, and we will eat Him and enjoy Him to become His reproduction today.

We are not here to try to **imitate His living and take Him as an outward pattern** for us to try to reproduce by our own ability and strength. We are believers in Christ who need to **eat Christ** as the meal offering, and He in us will **enable us** to live the same kind of life, even making us a meal offering corporately for the satisfaction of God and the feeding of man.

The characteristics of Christ's humanity are extraordinary love, boundless forbearance, unparalleled faithfulness, absolute humility, utmost purity, supreme holiness and righteousness, and brightness and uprightness. He as such a One lives in us, and we need to enjoy Him and be mingled with Him every day. Such a One is our food, and as we pray-read the word of God, the humanity of Jesus with His human life and human living is infused into us to constitute us as the duplication of Christ with His God-man living.

How can we live the same kind of life that Jesus lived? How can our Christian life be a duplication of Christ's God-man living? The key is found in Romans 8: here we have Christ's **humanity** (v. 3), the **Spirit of life** (v. 2), the **cross** (v. 13), and **resurrection** (v. 11). We should live the same kind of life that Jesus lived, and our Christian life should be a duplication of Christ's God-man living. How? Just as He was a man, so we have His humanity in our spirit. Just as Christ was mingled with the Spirit, so we need to be mingled with the Spirit. Just as He bore the fragrance of resurrection as He lived a crucified life, so we by the Spirit need to put the death the practices of the body and live in spirit.

How can this be worked out practically? It is very simple: we need to **eat Christ** as the meal offering, and we will become what we eat and live by what we eat. [His humanity] fulfills all righteousness, had no resting place, lowly in heart, loves the weak ones, flexible, serves others, cherishes people, not sloppy but orderly, limited by time, unique, knows when to weep and is humble.

The meal offering can be in **different forms**: it can be in the form of **flour mingled with oil**, or it may be in the form of **a cake**; the flour meal offering signifies the individual Christ and the individual Christian, and the cake meal offering signifies the church life as the corporate meal offering... Eating the Lord as the reality of the meal offering is not something we do in a wild way, in a lawless way, or in an unregulated way. God wants to train us [as priests] to enjoy Christ,... and partake of Christ in His way for God's satisfaction... In order for us to satisfy God, we need to follow certain procedures and abide by certain rules, which in the New Testament are the **law of the Spirit of life in our spirit**... As we serve God as priests in the church life, and as we enjoy Christ as our sinless supply, the unleavened meal offering, we need to deal with the sin in our fallen nature and the sins in our conduct... for eating of Christ is most holy.

"Lord Jesus, we take You as our life supply, the sinless meal offering, to be our sinless supply for our service to God as priests. Train us in our eating and in our living in the church life. We want to maintain our enjoyment of You so that we would continually enjoy You, partake of You, feed on You, and we would enjoy Christ for God continually."

## LIFE STUDY OF COLOSSIANS

"One Life-Study a Day Makes One Holy"

#### Not to be Deluded and Carried Off from Christ

July 23, 2018, Monday (Message 21)

If we take Christ as life, hold Him as the Head of the Body, know Him as the mystery of God, experience Him as the hope of glory, and walk in Him as the all-inclusive Spirit, then we shall not be deceived by anything or by anyone. Those who do not experience Christ in these aspects can easily be deceived. If you analyze the situation of those who have been deluded and carried off as spoil, you will realize that they did not experience Christ in these five ways. They did not realize that Christ alone is everything in God's economy, and they did not take Christ as their life or as their Head. Furthermore, they did not experience the indwelling Christ as their hope of glory, nor did they live, move, and have their being in Christ. As a result, they were defenseless, and eventually were deluded and carried off into captivity. Our defense against deception is the Christ who is our life, our Head, the mystery of God, the hope of glory, and the good land in which we walk. (Excerpt from the Life-Study of Acts, chapter 21, section)

## Made Full and Circumcised in Christ

July 24, 2018, Tuesday (Message 22)

In this message we have seen that, positively, we have been made full in Christ and that, negatively, we have been circumcised in Him. Therefore, there is no need for us to worship angels or to practice asceticism. Although these practices were prevailing among the Colossians, we should utterly cast them aside. We do not worship angels, and we do not practice asceticism. We are in Christ. In Him we have been made full and are short of nothing. In Him we have been circumcised from every negative thing. For this reason, we do not need asceticism to restrict the indulgence of the flesh. This was the concept of the Apostle Paul. I believe that his writing concerning this matter in Colossians 2 will be helpful to us today. (Excerpt from the Life-Study of Acts, chapter 22, section 2)

### The Economy of God's Salvation

July 25, 2018, Wednesday (Message 23)

The environment and the atmosphere are very suitable for God to contact us. Furthermore, God is not here to judge us, for He has already judged us on the cross. He is not even here to deal with us, because He has dealt with us already. God is here to accomplish one thing—to enliven us by imparting life into us. As the life-giving Spirit, the Triune God is giving life to us. In the meetings of the church life, we are being enlivened. Concerning this, the law and the angels have no place. We should remind the rulers and authorities that at Calvary God stripped them off and triumphed over them. Based upon God's victory, we can order them to flee. What we need today is not the law or the angels, but the enlivening One, the life-giving One. This is the economy of God's salvation. (Excerpt from the Life-Study of Colossians, chapter 23, section 3)

## Christ—the Body of All the Shadows

July 26, 2018, Thursday (Message 24)

Christ is the body of all the shadows. This means that He is the reality of our food and drink, of our completion and rest, of our new beginning with light in darkness, and of our enjoyment and joy. Every day, week, month, and year we need Christ. All the positive things in our daily life, weekly life, monthly life, and yearly life must be Christ. Christ must become everything to us not merely in a doctrinal way, but in the way of experience. I can testify that Christ is my completion, my rest, my new beginning, my enjoyment, my joy, my food, my drink, and my satisfaction. Although Christ is universally vast, He is also all the detailed aspects of our practical daily living. Day by day, He is our breath and everything to us. (Excerpt from the Life-Study of Colossians, chapter 24, section 2)

## **Christ Versus Mysticism**

July 27, 2018, Friday (Message 25)

If we are not preserved in Christ, the religious element in our being may give rise to many strange things. Our fallen nature with our reprobate mind is one with the evil one. The evil spirits can still have contact with our reprobate mind. The fallen mind is continually committing fornication with the evil spirits. This causes various kinds of evil things to be transmitted into us, things that may cause us to act in an abnormal manner, even to pray, sing, or praise in strange ways. For this reason, as the Bible says, we need a sober mind, a mind renewed according to the image of the One who created us. If we have such a renewed mind, we shall be preserved in Christ and enjoy Him in the church life. The main reason Paul wrote the book of Colossians was to rescue the saints from fraud and to preserve them in Christ for the proper church life. (Excerpt from the Life-Study of Colossians, chapter 25, section 3)
