<u>Crystallization-Study – Epistle to the Romans</u>

Introduction

The Book of Romans is on the Gospel of God

- The entire book is the gospel of God to men in its completeness.
- Rom. 12:5 So we who are many are one Body in Christ, and individually members one
 of another.
- The Body of Christ is first mentioned in the New Testament in Romans 12.
 - The last five chapters in Romans begins with the Body of Christ and conclude with the local churches for the fellowship and communication of the Body of Christ.
 - The Body of Christ is the very organism of the Triune God, and the local churches are the fellowship and the communication of the Body of Christ.
- The center of the book of Romans is Jesus Christ the God-man.

The Center of the Gospel of God – Jesus Christ the God-man

- The person of Christ is of two aspects divine and human.
- In humanity, He was the seed of David.
 - Christ in His humanity was of the old creation.
 - In His humanity He was "according to the flesh," "the flesh of sin" in its likeness but without sin.
- This seed of David in His humanity was sonized, was made the Son of God.
 - o Through resurrection, Christ made His humanity divine.
- The Son of God is the divine part of Christ.
- Out of resurrection, which is the consummation of the processed Triune God, Jesus Christ as a man in the flesh was made the firstborn Son of God.
 - When the Son of God was merely the only begotten Son of God, He had only divinity.
 - But now He has His humanity, and His humanity has been made divine to become a part of Him as the Son of God.
 - The regenerated believers, having both humanity and divinity, are to be conformed to the image of this firstborn Son of God.

The Work of Jesus Christ the God-man

- The first preliminary step for Christ's work was His incarnation.
 - He came as God in the Triune God's divinity to be the flesh in its likeness but without sin.
 - o This was to bring God into man, making God and man mingled as one person.
 - He is the God-man in the universe, as a model, a prototype, for the mass reproduction of many sons of God, for the accomplishment of God's eternal economy.
 - This is the initiation of God's new creation.
- After being born as a God-man, He needed to live as such a person.
 - His living was through death—dying to live.
 - o It was a living of righteousness before God.
 - o His human living qualified Him to be the Redeemer of the unrighteous men.
- After He walked through the preliminary steps of incarnation and human living, He began His earthly ministry.
 - o In His earthly ministry He did mainly two things:
 - Consummated His all-inclusive death
 - Carried out the life-imparting and new-creation-germinating resurrection
 - Christ died a death that He volunteered to accomplish. This is His all-inclusive death.
 - He bore the transgressions and iniquities of God's chosen people.
 - He died for the sins of the believers by bearing their sins on the cross.
 - He condemned sin in the flesh.
 - He accomplished God's eternal redemption to bring God's people back to God.
 - He terminated the old creation signified by our old man, including our flesh.
 - He destroyed Satan.
 - He judged the world and cast out Satan as the ruler of the world.
 - Christ carried out the life-imparting and the new-creation-germinating resurrection.
 - His resurrection was a releasing of the divine life within Him.
 - In resurrection He, as the last Adam in His flesh, became (was transfigured—pneumatized—into) the life-giving Spirit, the Spirit of life.

- He regenerated His believers in His resurrection with Him in one great, corporate birth to be the many sons of God and His many brothers, who, as the many sons, are to be conformed to the image of Him as the firstborn Son of God.
- The life-giving Spirit is the germinating factor of the Body of Christ as the new creation of God.
- In His heavenly ministry He, as the pneumatic Christ, the Spirit of life, indwells us in the heavenlies to give life to our mortal bodies to minister the divine life of the processed and consummated God into us, the dying ones, for the building up of the Body of Christ, which will consummate in the New Jerusalem for the accomplishing of the eternal economy of God.
- In His heavenly ministry He, as the pneumatic Christ, intercedes for us in our weakness with groanings within us in the heavenlies that we may grow in Him unto maturity to reach our sonship in full, which is the redemption of our body, the glorification of our entire being.
 - o Christ is interceding for us in our weakness through our groaning.
 - He is groaning within us in the heavenlies that we may grow in Him unto maturity.
- He intercedes at the right hand of God in the heavens for us that we, His many brothers and members, who are the many God-men, could overcome the oppositions and any kind of circumstances and be kept in union with Him in His unconditional love so that we may be conformed to the image of Him, to be His consummated mass reproduction for the constitution of His corporate and organic Body.
- His earthly ministry produced the many sons of God who are His many brothers as the constituents for the building up of His Body.
- His heavenly ministry ministers the divine life to His members that they may grow unto maturity, unto the redemption of their body, the glorification of God's redeemed people, and keeps all His members in union with Him that they may be conformed to the image of Him as the prototype for the mass reproduction of Him for the carrying out of God's eternal economy.
