About Us

On June 22, 2008, five saints began meeting on the proper ground of oneness, including a family of four and a brother that was gained by the Lord on campus in Winnipeg and who was working at that time in Regina. In early 2009, two additional families from Montreal also immigrated to the capital city. Since that time, the brothers and sisters continued meeting regularly every Lord's Day in the homes until eventually the saints rented a place for meetings.

After much prayer and thorough fellowship with the surrounding localities and the co-workers, the Church in Regina became established and began breaking bread on March 17, 2013. A total of over 150 saints from the different localities all over Canada battled a snowstorm to witness the first Lord's Table Meeting.

Since then and until now, the saints continued to grow in number and in life. The Lord has truly been faithful to add more brothers and sisters through immigration. We feel that the Lord is continually moving, shepherding, and strengthening the church through the yearly increase.

At present, the saints regularly meet in person. Around 40 saints attend the Lord's Table Meetings, the Church Pursuit Meetings and the Prayer Meetings weekly. There are also regular Children's Meetings and Young People with College Students Meetings on campus. For the church's plan and activities, there are coordinating brothers who meet once a month to pray and fellowship.

THE NEED FOR THE CHURCH TO BEAR FRUIT

The first commission from the Lord to the church is to preach the gospel, to bring new believers to the church. I met a group of brothers and sisters who considered themselves to be the most spiritual persons in their locality. They were very nice, spiritual, and everything about them was good. However, I asked them, “Brothers, how long have you been meeting in this way, and with how many persons did you start to meet?” They said that they had been meeting for a long time and that they had started with about twenty persons, the same number they had when I spoke with them. Whenever they came together, they were very nice and spiritual, but they had no fruit, no converts. This is wrong.

How can a tree not bring forth fruit if it is truly living? As a church, we must be prevailing in winning souls. We need to check ourselves by many ways to see if we are right or wrong; one way to check ourselves is by whether or not we bring forth fruit. The number of the members of the church must increase all the time. New converts must be added to the church constantly. I hope that the churches will bring forth fruit in the next half year. Then that will be our “fruit season.” If we do not bring forth fruit, there must be something wrong with us. We cannot and should not gather together week after week, singing hymns and listening to good messages, but not bring in new converts after one, two, or even three years. If so, there is something wrong with the church, and there is also something wrong with the believers.

HELPING THE SAINTS TO PREACH THE GOSPEL BY MANY MEANS

There are many ways to preach the gospel. The metropolitan centers are crowded with people day by day. There are many “fish,” and it is easy to catch one. The only problem is that we may not be prepared to do it, and we may have no intention of doing it. The church must be helped to learn how to pray, how to preach the gospel, and how to prepare gospel tracts and good booklets. Then the brothers must have the habit of distributing the booklets, mailing the tracts, and so on, in order to stir up the city and even stir up the country.

More than fifty percent of the people in the United States are at least nominal Christians. Of these, about half are Catholics and half are Protestants, and in addition, many of the nominal Christians are false believers. This still leaves many millions who are unbelievers, Gentiles, to preach the gospel to. Many missionaries are going out from this country to the Philippines and to other countries, but in the United States there are many more millions of unbelievers than in the Philippines. What a big field there is here. I came from the Far East, and I have traveled throughout many nations. I have to say, “Praise the Lord for the United States!” because it is the best field for the Lord’s work. We have all the conveniences, and it is so easy to preach the gospel.

If we do this, this will be a protection to us as Christians. In Ephesians 6:15 Paul tells us that the firm foundation of the gospel is our **shoes**. Shoes protect us from the earth. If we do not have shoes, our feet become dirty and damaged. To protect our feet from being hurt, damaged, and dirty, we need a good pair of shoes. If as a Christian we do not preach the gospel, we are “barefoot.” **The best way to keep our feet from being dirtied and damaged by the world is to preach the gospel to our friends, neighbors, and schoolmates, telling them something about the Lord Jesus.** To preach the gospel in this way helps us to be better Christians. It always reminds us that we are Christians. We are reminded not to do certain things with persons to whom we have preached the gospel. It is simply because we do not testify for the Lord Jesus that we can do certain things with our friends. We should tell all our friends and neighbors, **“I am a proper, normal Christian, and I wish to tell you that you need to love the Lord.”** Try to do this, and see what will come out. Being a testimony to people helps us to be humble, sincere, careful, faithful, and to try our best to love others. This is the best pair of shoes for our Christian feet. Let us pray for this and try to help all the saints who meet together with us to have such a habit.

At a certain point, when the leading ones of the church realize that the church needs to have **a gospel campaign**, a gospel meeting, they should call the saints together every evening to have a week of prayer meetings to pray specifically in preparation for the gospel preaching. Then, we need at least one or two weeks more to come together to train them how to preach, how to take care of their relatives, how to invite and bring people to the meeting, and how to come to work together in a coordinated way to preach the gospel in coordination. Here I have given only some general ideas. **May the Lord help us to practice these things in the church service.**

EXERCISING DISCERNMENT IN PREACHING THE GOSPEL

The principle in visiting people with the gospel is to **first help them to get saved and baptized**. As we are preaching the gospel, we should learn to exercise our discernment concerning whether a person will be difficult to gain or not. If we discern that the environment, the family, and so forth would make it difficult to gain someone, we should **not** invest our time in that person. A carpenter selects a certain kind of wood based on what he intends to make with it. He must discern what kind of material will be fitting for his use. We should also discern in the same way when we preach the gospel, because there are many different kinds of people on the earth. We must be wise and learn to discern people while we are talking to them.

AVOIDING VAIN LABOR BY LEARNING TO LABOR IN A PROPER WAY

I have noticed that when some saints go out, they quickly gain people, but others may go out faithfully, having little result. The problem with the second group of saints is the lack of training. Though we labor a great deal, our labor may be in vain if we do not labor in the proper way. The labor in the gospel and home meetings must be **regular, consistent, and continuous**. If one member of a team of three is sick, it would be better for the other two to go visit the new one than to have some change of hands in the visiting. To change the persons who labor in a particular home meeting will almost certainly cause a lot of loss. The best way is not to change the persons who visit the home meetings. To change the persons damages the coordination among the saints who have been laboring together to take care of the home meeting. The issue of such constant changes will be confusion among the saints who are laboring, and the time with the new believer will be wasted. Therefore, it is better to maintain the same members in the visiting groups.

THIS LIFE BEING THE LIFE OF GOD WITHIN US

After we have been saved, we have God living in us to be our life. This life is the life of prayer within us. The first function, the characteristic and the ability of this life, is to pray. Therefore, after being saved, the thing a proper Christian likes to do most is pray. For example, characteristically, a duck likes to swim in the water. If you send a little chicken and a little duck to the water, the chicken will run away hurriedly, while the little duck will quickly go into swim. This happens because the characteristic of the love of water is in the duck's nature. **Similarly, the life of God within us has a characteristic that loves to pray.** All real believers are like this. If they stop praying for three days, they do not feel good inside. If they stop praying for one week, they will feel even worse within. If they stop praying for a long while, they will feel as if they have lost something or some dear ones have died. On the contrary, whenever they pray, they feel good inside, because a characteristic of the life within them is that it likes to pray. It not only demands prayer, but it also has the ability to pray.

Actually, we cannot teach a person to pray. The most we can do is point out a way, for the real ability to pray is hidden in the life of a Christian. As long as you are a saved one, there is such a life with such a function within you. Yes, we do teach the brothers and sisters to pray; but please remember, we can only teach because within them there is already a life with such a function. For example, you cannot teach a dog to speak. No matter how hard you try, it is futile, for within the dog there is no ability to speak. This ability is not found in the animal life but only in the human life. If I am always conversing with an Englishman, I believe after five or six months I will be able to speak English very fluently. However, we may have cats and dogs in our homes that have been with us for years yet cannot speak one sentence because they do not have that ability within them. In like manner, **no matter how hard you try to teach an unsaved person to pray, he still cannot pray, does not like to pray, and is bothered whenever he sees Christians praying.** In fact, some friends told me that whenever they saw us kneeling down to pray, they felt quite embarrassed. They do not understand that we would have felt uneasy unless we did pray. The God whom we have received has become our life within, and this life has a function; that function is to pray. As long as we do not restrict this life but give it the liberty and the opportunity to be exercised, then not only does it desire to pray; it will pray.

Of course, just as man needs training for speech, he also needs training for proper prayer. Prayers will improve more rapidly with some guidance, but this is altogether a different matter. We need to see that it is God's life within us that becomes our life of prayer. **Therefore, if we desire to be a man of prayer, we must learn to always live in God.** The more we live in God, the more the characteristic of this life will be manifested, and the more we will desire to pray. This life within us has a characteristic that makes us desire to pray, an ability that enables us to pray, and a demand that requires us to live in God. Therefore, prayer is a matter of life.

In helping new believers, we need to point out strongly that **prayer is not just an outward activity but an inward matter of life.** Prayer issues from the characteristics and abilities of a life, and this life is the very life of God. Hence, God requires you to always live in His life. Whenever the fellowship between you and God is interrupted, this life in you is in a half-dead state; consequently, you dislike praying, and you are almost unable to pray. You must restore the fellowship with God and live in Him, thus causing the life within you to be resurrected. Thus, spontaneously you can touch the consciousness of prayer within, you have the desire and interest to pray, and you possess the ability to pray. You know what to say and how to say it, and you also know which word of prayer can touch God's throne and hit the center of His heart. Others may not be able to teach you, but you know inside because this is a matter of the inward life. The life in you has the ability to enable you to pray.

THIS LIFE BEING HOLY, SEPARATED

This prayer life within us, because it is the life of God, is separated from everything that is unbecoming to God. This life, therefore, requires you to be separated from the world, and demands that you put aside anything that is outside God. **If you want to be a man of prayer who can pray, is willing to pray, and who prays properly, you must agree with the demand of the life in you by putting aside whatever it wants you to put aside.** Whenever you disagree even slightly with its demand for holiness, you put to death the life of prayer. It is as if you have seized it by the throat. Never think to yourself, "Oh, it is just a little worldliness; it is not a great sin." It is not a matter of great or small but whether or not this life makes a demand in you. If it demands of you to forsake something that is outside God, then you should do it.

Brothers and sisters, I believe that you have had this kind of experience. Sometimes this holy life within you demands that you not wear a man of a certain dress. When it makes such a demand, you may reason and say, "This is not sinful, and it does not matter if I wear it." You may reason, but the life of prayer would not listen to you. Once the life of prayer within you makes a demand for holiness, it never listens to any argument. If you do not agree, you cannot pray afterward.
