## One Accord and Crucial Aspects of the Book of Acts—Week 1

We need to have a clear view of these **two histories**—the **physical human history** and **the mysterious divine history**—and I hope that we all will have such a view. The history of man, the history of the world, is **outward**. The divine history, the history of God in and with humanity, is **inward**. This history is a matter of the divine mystery of the Triune God in humanity.

We can say that the physical human history is like a shell, but within that shell is a kernel, and the kernel of that shell is the divine history. On the one hand, there is the outward, physical, human history; on the other hand, there is the inward, divine history, the history of God with man and in man. In another portion Brother Lee correlates these **two portions of the divine history** to the **Old and New Testament**: God's history is of two portions—the **history of God with man**, found in the Old Testament, and **the history of God in man**, found in the New Testament. In the Old Testament God's history was a history with man. In the New Testament God's history is a history in man, for this history involves God's being one with man. Therefore, the history of God in the New Testament is a divine history in humanity.

We can say that **the divine history**, which is the history of God in man, was **from Christ's incarnation through His ascension to become the life-giving Spirit**. This **divine history continues** with His indwelling us through God's organic salvation. The divine history is **continuing in our being** through all the steps of His organic salvation—which are **regeneration, sanctification, renewing, transformation, conformation, and glorification**—to make us the glorious bride of Christ. We thank the Lord that the divine history is going on among us...

At the time of the Lord's coming back, there will be a meeting of **two figures**. The first figure is **Antichrist**, a figure in the outward, human history. The second Figure is **Christ with His overcomers**, the figure in the intrinsic, divine history. Concerning this, Brother Lee says, "The Figure in the divine history will defeat the figure in the human history and then cast him into the lake of fire (Rev. 19:20)". When Christ comes back, He will descend with His overcomers as His army to defeat Antichrist and his army. After the Figure in the divine history defeats the figure in the human history, the thousand-year kingdom will come, and this kingdom will consummate in the New Jerusalem, the ultimate and consummate step of the divine history. Praise the Lord for the divine history!

Brother Lee says, "We all were born in the human history, but we have been reborn, regenerated, in the divine history. Now we need to **ask ourselves** this question: **Are we living in the divine history, or are we living merely in the human history?** If our living is in the world, we are living in the human history. But if we are living in the church, we are living in the divine history. In the church life God's history is our history. Now two parties—God and we—have one history, the divine history. This is the church life." (Excerpts from The Ministry of the Word, vol. 29, No. 05, p. 11-12).
