The Coming of the Kingdom and its Process

*How do we enter into the kingdom? It is not by learning or by studying or by keeping any outward regulations. It is by regeneration. We enter into the kingdom **by the Lord Jesus coming** into us and giving us all things relating to life and godliness. All things relating to life and godliness are now inside of us.
