THE INIQUITY OF THE SANCTUARY

Num. 18:1 - Then Jehovah said to Aaron, You and your sons and your father's household with you shall bear the iniquity of the sanctuary; and you and your sons with you shall bear the iniquity of your priesthood.

Rom 11:36 - Because out from Him and through Him and to Him are all things.

To Him be the glory forever. Amen.

God's Word shows us

- There are sins committed in our daily life
 - sins that are committed before man
 - sins that are committed against ordinary laws
- There are sins committed in the work
 - sins that are committed before God
 - sins that are committed against the sanctuary

❖ The sins of the priests were iniquities committed against the sanctuary.

- A worker of the Lord can commit an additional kind of sin.
- A sin pertaining to the work may not necessarily involve such things as pride or jealousy.
 - when the flesh is manifested.
 - when the self-will is exposed,
 - when one speaks rashly or makes suggestions rashly, one often commits the special sin that pertains to the work
- > Sinning in the work means offending God in His holiness, glory, and sovereignty.

Three very important considerations in God's work.

- First, the initiation of God's work must be according to His will.
 - no work can be initiated by ourselves
 - no decision should be made through the discussion of two or three brothers
 - do not be His counselor (Job 38:2-3; Rom. 11:34)
 - God can only be satisfied when His will is fulfilled
- Second, the advance of God's work must be according to His **power**.
 - no work can be carried out by our own strength or ability
 - God's work can only be accomplished by God's power
- Third, the result of God's work must be for His glory.
 - no work should result in our own glory
 - God's work is God's glory; God wants to have all the glory
 - He can give everything to man.
 - He is even willing to give His Son to man.
 - o But He will not give His glory to man.
 - we can only enter into the Lord's glory
 - stealing God's glory is committing the iniquity of the sanctuary

❖ We cannot consider any of God's work as a common thing

- There is distinction between holy things and common things.
 - No priest could consider his work a common thing.
 - the priests changed the showbread, dressed the lamp, and burned the incense
 - o they did the same things day after day and year after year
 - but if they were just a little bit careless, they would have committed the iniquity of the sanctuary and died
 - If a man enters the **Holy of Holies**, he should only see the ark, which is Christ, and the cherubim above the ark, which represent God's glory
 - We should not fall into unholiness through touching something in a common way.
 - o the first time you baptized someone,
 - you were probably quite serious
 - but after five or ten times, it becomes common to you
 - o The first time a worker has to give a message,
 - he is very serious
 - but after he speaks a few more times, it becomes a common thing to him
 - The first time we have to bless the bread we are solemnly aware of its significance.
 - we are very careful before the Lord, and we are truly like the priests
 - but gradually, we become more relaxed
 - our spiritual feeling is not as strong as before, and we have little spirit for prayer and worship
 - A person may think that since he has done it before, he can do the same thing today. In this
 way he loses his spiritual freshness and the power of life. There are three results or
 punishments for the iniquity of the sanctuary.
 - First, there is a loss of the **power of life**; a man becomes stale.
 - Second, there is the experience of spiritual death; there may even be sicknesses or physical death.
 - o Third, there will be the judgment at the judgment seat.
