The Factor of Authority in the Body of Christ and in the Local Churches

- In order that He might make known the riches of His glory upon vessels of mercy, which He had before Rom. 9:23 prepared unto glory, Matt. 28:18 - And Jesus came and spoke to them, saying, All authority has been given to Me in heaven and on earth. Eph. 1:22 - And He subjected all things under His feet and gave Him to be Head over all things to the church, - Which is His Body, the fullness of the One who fills all in all. Eph .1:23 Let us therefore come forward with boldness to the throne of grace that we may receive mercy and Heb. 4:16 find grace for timely help. - Immediately I was in spirit; and behold, there was a throne set in heaven, and upon the throne there Rev. 4:2 was One sitting: And he showed me a river of water of life, bright as crystal, proceeding out of the throne of God and of Rev. 22:1 the Lamb in the middle of its street. Rev. 22:2 And on this side and on that side of the river was the tree of life, producing twelve fruits, yielding its

Day 1

I. God is the supreme authority

➤ God's authority is actually God Himself

Rom. 9:21 – "... the potter has authority over the clay ..."
Rom. 9:22 – "... God, wishing to demonstrate His wrath and make His power known ..."

fruit each month; and the leaves of the tree are for the healing of the nations.

- All authority is from God
- Knowing authority is an inward revelation, not an outward teaching
- Being God alone is not adequate for Him to be the Head

Acts 17:31 – "... He is to judge to world in righteousness by the man whom He has designated ..."

- God will not exercise His judgment in His administration alone
 - o God needs an administration, to carry out His eternal purpose
 - o God needs a government to deal with His enemy and all the evil powers
 - o God as the creator would never lower His status to deal directly with Satan
 - God needs man, another creature to carry out God's eternal purpose and to deal with Satan
- In the Old Testament Christ was only the Son of God, not yet the Son of Man
- In God's economy for Christ to have the full headship, He needs two natures
 - o the divine nature
 - o the human nature
- The headship of Christ was not fully established in the Old Testament because Christ was not yet incarnated
 - o by incarnation He picked up the human element
 - by being crucified He accomplished God's eternal purpose and defeated and destroyed God's enemy

The Lord Jesus was a man under authority

- In His divinity as the only begotten **Son of God**
 - o had authority over all

- In His humanity as the **Son of Man**
 - o He humbled Himself (Phil. 2:7)
 - o did the Father's will (John 4: 34; 6:38)
 - was obedient unto death, even the death of the cross (Phil, 2:8)
- After His resurrection as the **King** of the heavenly kingdom
 - o all authority in heaven and on earth was given to Him (Matt. 28:18)
- In Christ ascension as the **Ruler** of the kings of the earth
 - the Ruler over all the ones in power (Rev. 1:5)
 - o the Chief Ruler in the divine government for the fulfillment of God's eternal plan
 - o inaugurated Him into the headship of the universe
- Now (in His heavenly ministry) as the **Head** of the Body, the church
 - o the headship of Christ is fully established
 - o Head of every man
 - o Head over all things to the church
- We need the heavenly light, vision and revelation, to see the vision of the truth
- Lord open our inner eyes that we may see your eternal purpose

Day 2

II. Christ is both the Head -

- ✓ Corporately of the Body, the church (Col. 1:18)
- ✓ Individually of all the believers (Eph. 4:15)
- ✓ He is the Head directly of every one of us, and we all are under His authority
- Christ to be the Head, corporately of the Body
 - He has all the authority in the Body
 - the Body can move only at His direction

Christ is the Head, individually of all the believers

- we must know the Body life in order to be under His authority
- we must submit to Him, as members, our only one Head
 - o we are related directly to the Head
 - o we have the same standing and there should be no intermediary members
 - o we receive orders directly from the Head
- we must honor and testify the unique headship of our exalted Christ
- we must live in the Body

The authority of the Head flowing throughout the whole Body

- we need to recognize the authority in the Body
- we need to care for the Body
- we need to know the deputy authorities, carrying out the authority of the Head
 - o the apostles (1 Cor. 12:28)
 - o the elders (Acts 14:23; 1 Tim 5:17)
- we need to submit to the deputy authorities of the Head (Heb. 13:17)
- we must submit to the Head directly (Eph. 5:24)
- ♣ Only Christ our Lord is the unique Head, and only He has the authority to direct the moves of the members of His Body.
- ♣ We all need to go to the Lord, pray to seek the Lord's leading directly.
- ♣ In the church there is no Head other than Christ, it is an insult to Him to have other heads or subheads.

1Cor. 14:40 - But all things must be done becomingly and in order.

III. The authority in the church-the honoring of the unique headship of Christ.

- ➤ The **order** of the church comes from the authority in the church—honoring of the headship of Christ
 - the Head of the church is Christ the Lord
 - the authority in the church is the headship of Christ
 - o the head holds up the body
 - o without the head the body cannot stand
 - there is no human organization in the church but there is a spiritual order
- ➤ Only by submitting to the headship of Christ can we have the real practice of the church life.
 - to have a spiritual order in the church is to practice the real church life
 - by realizing the headship of Christ in a practical way
- **♦** We must realize, honor and respect the headship of the Lord.
- ↓ Learn the lesson of always submitting ourselves to the headship of the Lord.
- As members of the Body, glorify and honor the Lord Jesus by taking Him as the Head.

Day 4

IV. In the church God's authority is expressed and represented by the apostles and the elders

- ➤ God has appointed elders and apostles to be the authority in the church (1 Cor. 12:28; Acts 15:6; 16:4-5)
 - In order to manifest His authority in the church
 - o **but** the elders and apostles have no authority in themselves
 - o they have authority only as they stand under the authority of the Head
 - o they exercise authority in the church **by** representing the authority of the Head
 - We must abandon hierarchy and kind of organization
- ➤ The office of the apostleship universal (Romans 1:5)
 - There is only one office of apostleship
 - Gives the position and right to appoint elders (Acts 14:23; Titus 1:5)
 - To establish elders in every city that is to establish elders in every church
- ➤ The office of the eldership local (Acts 20:28)
 - According to the leading of the Holy Spirit
 - o not voted in by the congregation
 - o appointed according to the maturity of life
 - o care for the leadership and shepherding in the churches
 - For the administration of the local churches
 - o scriptural principle of eldership is plurality
 - o no definite leader, the headship of Christ is regarded, preserved, and respected
 - For representing and expressing God's authority (1 Pet. 5:1-3)
 - To shepherd, to take all-inclusive care of the flock, the church of God

- o bear the burden of shepherding
- o taking care of the situation of the flock and meeting the needs
- ₩ we need to obey the ones leading us and submit to them (Heb. 13:17)

Day 5

V. The divine government in the church today

- ✓ comes from the throne of God and of the Lamb (Rev. 22:1-2)
- ✓ set up in heaven (Rev. 4)
- ✓ come forward to the throne of grace, at the Holy of Holies (Heb. 4:16, footnote 1)
- ➤ The throne of grace to share in God's all-sufficient the flowing grace

 Heb. 4:16 "... come forward ... to the throne of grace that we may receive mercy and find grace ..."
 - The flowing grace from the throne is the unique source of life supply
 - For God to dispense Himself to us
 - o as life
 - o as the life supply
 - o and as the all-sufficient grace
 - The Lord Jesus reign in the churches through the flowing of His life as grace
 - o reigning is through the flow of life
 - o the more we partake of His life, the more authority we have
 - o the Christ whom we live out will be our authority over others
- The throne of authority the divine administration, His headship Rev. 4:2 "... there was a throne set up in heaven ..."
 - Both grace and authority are one for His divine administration
 - The church is the place where God exercises His authority
 - His authority and reign should have a ground in us
 - We must submit to His authority
 - allow the Lord to be seated on the throne within us
 - o allow Him to establish His kingdom and obtain dominion in our being
 - o allow the power of the Lord to be expressed through us
 - o allow the divine life to supply us
- We need to come to throne to drink from the water of life and to eat the tree of life for our life supply.
- We need to submit to the throne, so that we can share in His all-sufficient grace

Day 6

- The throne of God and of the Lamb the source of the divine fellowship

 Rev. 22:1-2 "... a river of water of life, bright as crystal, proceeding out of the throne of God and of the Lamb in the middle of its street."
 - The flowing water of life is a matter of fellowship and related to authority
 - o the line of authority can be seen in the order and coordination of the members in the human body
 - o the line of fellowship, the member is connected with other members in the body through the circulation of the blood

- $\circ\quad$ every member renders a supply to the other members and receives a supply from other members
- God in the Lamb is the flowing out as grace for our enjoyment
- The flow of the divine supply
 - o the river of the water of life is for our beverage
 - o within this river grows the tree of life for our food
- → We allow God and the Lamb to be enthroned in our being, to rule and reign in us, so that life will be manifested as power that supplies us inwardly.
- ♣ We must give Him the dominion.
