How to Possess the Land

By the Lamb, the Manna, the Ark, and the Tabernacle

A Corporate Matter

- We can never possess the all-inclusive Christ by ourselves as individuals.
- To enter in and take possession of the good land is not for individuals but for a corporate body.

The Lamb

- Christ is the lamb for our redemption.
- We must first be redeemed by Him before we can ever obtain Him as the all-inclusive One.
- We must experience Christ as the <u>limited</u> lamb; then we may press on to obtain Him as the <u>unlimited</u> Christ.

The Manna

- Manna is a substance with the nature of the vegetable life, the nature of the animal life, and the nature of the transformed life.
- By partaking of Christ as our daily manna, we may be transformed into material for the building of God.

The Ark

- The Ark is the testimony of God; the manifestation of God, the expression of God.
- Inside the Ark were the tablets with the Ten Commandments.
 - o The Ten Commandments are the manifestation of God.
 - o We may know what kind of God is by the Ten Commandments.
- The Ark is the type of Christ with two natures, the human nature (wood) and the divine nature (gold).
- We must not only have the lamb as our Redeemer and the daily manna as our food but also have the Ark of the Testimony as our center.

The Tabernacle

- The tabernacle is the enlargement of the Ark. The Ark, which is Christ, is within as our center, and we are the enlargement of this Christ as the tabernacle embodying the Ark.
- The tabernacle had four layers of covering over it.
 - The outermost one is porpoise skins, a strong protection against the wind, the rain and the heat of the sun.
 - Under the porpoise skins is rams' skins dyed red, signifying that Christ died and shed His blood for our sins.
 - The next under is the covering of goats' hair, signifying that Christ was made sin for us.
 - o The innermost covering is of linen, so fine, so full of glory, with the cherubim embroidered upon it.
- To be strengthened and qualified to enter the land, we must be unified by the divine nature.
- When we have the Ark as our center and we are built together as the tabernacle to embody this Ark, then the glory of God comes down and fills the tabernacle.

By the Offerings and the Priesthood

The Offerings

- The only proper way for us to approach the entrance and contact the tabernacle is by the offerings.
- Christ Himself is our offerings. The burnt offering, meal offering, peace offering, sin
 offering, and trespass offering are all Christ.
- We have to experience Christ and apply Christ hour by hour, instance by instance, in such a way that we will be qualified, enabled, and strengthened to go on and take possession of the all-inclusive Christ.

The Priesthood

- Aaron and his sons were all adorned and qualified to serve as priests to God. We must
 have this; we must have Christ as our Aaron, Christ as our High Priest, and all of us must
 be His sons, the priests to serve the Lord.
- Those who are living in Christ and by Christ to manifest Christ are the priests of today.

 The essential and basic thing is that one living in, walks in, enjoys, experiences, and applies Christ to all their life.

By the Governing Principles

The Presence of the Lord

- When, how and where the Lord's people should move and act depend on the presence of the Lord revealed to them in the pillar of cloud and in the pillar of fire.
- If we would go on to possess the land, we must do so by the presence of the Lord.
- Many times, the Lord goes with us, but His presence does not.
 - Never think that as long as the Lord helps us, it is sufficient. We must have the Lord's presence.
- The firsthand presence of the Lord will strengthen us with might to obtain the fullness, the all-inclusiveness of Christ.
- The Lord's presence is always in two things, either in the Spirit (cloud) or in the Word (fire). We can follow the Lord by His presence in the Spirit and in the Word.

The Priesthood with the Urim and the Thummim

- The second governing principle is the priesthood under the anointing with the Urim and the Thummim.
- The Lord's presence in the pillars of cloud and fire is for guidance, while the priesthood in the anointing with the Urim and Thummim is for judgment.
- The priesthood includes three things: communion or fellowship with the Lord, the anointing of the Holy Spirit, and the Urim and Thummim.
- All our problems and questions are solved by fellowship and anointing, reading in love
 the circumstances, natures, and daily lives of the believers with the light of the Lord's
 Word.

The Regulations of a Holy Life

- The regulations can be summed up into three minor principles.
 - We are the people who belong to the Lord.
 - o We have been separated from this world.
 - o The Lord is holy, so we too must be holy.

By the Formation of the Army

 Only after the experiences of Exodus and Leviticus is it possible for the people of God to be formed into an army to fight the battle for Him.

From the Lamb to an Army-A Checklist

- To possess the good land is not so simple.
 - We must enjoy Christ as the redeeming Lamb.
 - We must leave Egypt and enjoy Christ as our daily manna, as our daily supply.
 - We must enjoy Christ as the rock with living water flowing forth.
 - o We must enjoy Christ as the tabernacle.
 - We must experience Christ as all the offerings.
 - o We must experience Christ as the High Priest that we can assume the priesthood.
 - o We must be formed into an army.

Qualifications for the Army

- To be formed into an army, everyone must give his pedigree, his spiritual genealogy.
- A soldier must be someone with a matured life.
- All the people of Israel must be under their own standard according to their houses. They
 have no choice.
- We must be in order; we must learn the lesson of submission.
- We must always be fresh and young. Whenever we begin to get old, we must be renewed.
- We must first assume the priesthood. If we do not know how to keep the fellowship with the Lord, we will be unable to fight.

The Opposing Factors

Independence and Individualism

- In order to possess the good land, we must be built up; we must all be united into one body as the tabernacle.
- If we as a group of the Lord's people would go on to enjoy Christ in a more solid way than the redeeming lamb and the daily manna, we must be built up together into one body as the tabernacle under the cover of the fullness of Christ.
- If you are not built into the tabernacle, you are cut off, you are kept out.
- After the tabernacle, we come to the priesthood.

- The priesthood is not the ministry or service of any individual person but the service of the Body.
- For an army we need a host of people—the more the better.

Strange Fire

- Strange fire is our <u>natural enthusiasm</u>; it is the fervency of our natural emotions, our natural zeal of heart.
- We must be dealt with by the cross. Our natural zeal must be put to death by the cross.

Rebellion

- We must learn never to be rebellious, and learn to recognize authority.
- If we rebel, we will be spiritually cut off, and to a certain extent we will kill the testimony, the priesthood, and the army.

Unbelief

- We must avoid unbelief as this will surely kill us.
- In our natural strength we will never be able to attain the good land. It is possible by resurrection power alone.

Worldly Connections and Murmuring

- When the enemy can do nothing else to spoil us, he will come in a very subtle way to
 deceive us and cause us to forge a union with something worldly.
- We must be watchful never to murmur against the Lord. We must always sing His praise.
