Entering the Good Land

By Taking the Word of the Lord

- We must take the Word of the Lord.
 - o The Lord has promised it, but we must possess it.
 - o He has given it, but we must experience it.
 - o It is our portion, but we must take it.
- We must take the Word of God and go on to possess the land.

By Realizing That We Have Been Buried

- We must realize that we have been crucified on the cross.
- When we received Christ as our Saviour, the church baptized us—we were buried.
- Only resurrected people can enter and possess the all-inclusive Christ; He is not for the natural man.

By Applying the Death of Christ

- Believing that we have been crucified with Christ and that we have been buried, we must apply this death to ourselves.
 - o Therefore, we must be circumcised.
- We must apply His death to all our situation and moment by moment apply His death to our fleshly members and put them to death.

By Enjoying the Produce of the Land

- Immediately after applying the death of Christ to our members on the ground of being buried and resurrected with Him, we enjoy something of the life.
- Before this we were continually enjoying a little Christ—the manna. Now we are tasting the greater, the richer, the fuller Christ; now we are enjoying the land, the all-inclusive Christ.

By Fighting the Battle

- We must remember that there are evil powers in the heavenlies.
- We must fight the battle with the enemy.

How to Fight the Battle

- We go to a battle, but we go with instruments of peace. We go with rams' horns.
 - o Ram's horns are a symbol of a fighting a warfare with peaceful weapons.
 - o They are trumpets to be blown, declaring and proclaiming the gospel of peace.
- We fight by proclaiming Christ.
 - If we are going to testify the victorious Christ, there are many times when we must be silent.
 - We must let the priesthood blow the trumpet.
- We must remember that our enemies are not flesh and blood; they are not people.
 - Our enemies are the spiritual forces, the principalities, the powers in the heavenlies.

Life in the Land

Laboring in Christ

- The life we need to enjoy the good land is first of all a life of laboring on Christ.
- A life of making Christ our industry and producing Him in mass production.
 - o Christ is our industry and we must work on Christ to produce His riches.
- Whenever we come to the meetings, whenever we come to worship the Lord, we should not come with our hands empty.

How to Labor on Christ

• From the moment we awake in the morning, we need to say "Lord, here I am. I give myself to enjoy You. Grant me through the entire day, from this moment on, to experience and apply You in every situation. I am not asking for anything tomorrow. I am asking for grace to enjoy You today. Show me how to till the ground, sow the seed, and water the plants of the Lord."

Exhibiting Christ

- We are meeting together to have an exhibition of Christ, not just the Christ whom God gave us but the Christ we have produced, the Christ upon whom we have labored and whom we have experienced.
 - The church life is simply this. It is all the saints enjoying Christ before God and mutually with God.

Two Ways of Enjoying Christ

- There are two ways set forth for enjoying Christ.
 - o The personal, individual way.
 - The collective way.
- We as Christians may enjoy Christ anytime and anywhere by ourselves. But if we would
 enjoy Christ with the Lord's people as worship to God, we must go to the very place
 chosen by God.

<u>The Issue of the Land – The Temple and the City</u>

The Increasing Scale of Our Experience

- When we come to Lord and accept Him as our redeemer, the Christ we receive is whole, complete, and perfect, but as far as our experience of Him is concerned, we experience Him only on a small scale.
- Day by day in our experience, Christ is becoming greater and greater.

Maturity and Work

- When we are newly saved and spiritually immature, we enjoy Christ and He does
 everything for us.
- As we gradually mature in the Lord, we discover that we have something to do. We must bear some responsibility; we must work.
- The more we work on Christ, the more we will produce of Christ, the more we will enjoy
 Christ, the more we will have Christ to share with others, and the more we can offer
 Christ to God.
- Every time we come together to worship God in Christ, with Christ, and through Christ, we are offering Christ as the peace offering.

The Temple

- When we enjoy Christ in a corporate way, the habitation of God will come into being.
- If we are those who enjoy Christ as the good land to such an extent that we come together on the ground of oneness to enjoy Him mutually with God, we will be the proper church.
- The real church, the real expression of the Body of Christ, is a group of people mingled with Christ, saturated with Christ, enjoying Christ day by day, and coming together with

nothing but Christ. At that very moment they are the habitation of God; they are His house, His home.

The City

- The temple of God is enlarged by Christ as the authority of God.
 - o The enlargement of the temple of God is the city of God.
 - o By the authority of Christ the church is not only God's home but also His city.
- Everything with us must be Christ. This is the real expression of the Body of Christ. If we have such a reality, we have the land, we have the temple, and we have the city.
