Is Christmas a Christian Practice?

Christmas being on December 25th

- The 25th of December is referred to as the day of Christ' birth.
- It was originally the date when the Europeans worshipped the sun.
- The spread of the apostate church in Europe assimilated this ancient custom. However, the Europeans still wanted to celebrate the birthday of their god.
- To accommodate them, the apostate church declared December 25th the be the birthday of Christ.

Was Christ really born in Winter?

Luke 2:8

"And there were shepherds in the same region, spending their nights in the fields and keeping watch over their flock by night".

- The custom of the shepherds in Judea is to bring home their flocks before the start of November, prior to the onset of the cold winter months.
- Hence, Christ could not have been born in December.

Is the Christmas' account consistent with the scriptural record?

- The shepherds' visit of Jesus and the magi's visit occurred at different times and separate places.
- Matt 2:1-12 and Luke 2:1-20 records separate accounts of stories related to the birth of Jesus.
- We do not see the shepherds in Matthew 2, nor do we see the 'three kings' in Luke 2

The Origin of Christmas is paganistic

- Prior to conversion to Christianity,
 Mithraism was the most widespread and most influential pagan religion among the Roman subjects.
- On December 25, pagans celebrated
 Sol Invictus to worship their sun god.
- Eventually the apostate church took over the religion and replaced
 December 25th to be the Christmas.

Christmas Trees

Jeremiah 10:2 - Thus says Jehovah, / Do not learn the way of the nations, / And do not be terrified by the signs of the heavens, / Although the nations are terrified by them.

Jeremiah 10:3 - For the customs of the peoples are vanity, / Because their god is a tree cut from the forest, / The work of the hands of a craftsman with an ax.

Jeremiah 10:4 - **He adorns it with silver and with gold;** / They fasten it with nails and hammers / So that it cannot totter.

Jeremiah 10:5 - They are like a post in a cucumber field, / And they cannot speak; / They must be carried / Because they cannot walk. / Do not be afraid of them, / For they cannot do evil, / And neither is it in them to do good.

Gift Giving Origin

This originated from the Roman celebration of the feast of Saturnalia and Kalends of January (Roman New Year).
 Today's Christmas practice of exchanging gifts is based on the notion that gifts were presented during the Lord's birth. But the wise men gave gifts to the Lord and not to one another.

Santa Claus Origin

Saint Nicholas in the 4th century was said to have brought gifts to children by throwing them through the windows. The belief that he enters the house through the chimney comes from an Old Norse legend that believed the goddess Hertha appeared in the fireplace and brought good luck to the house.

Should Believers celebrate Christmas?

1 Corinthians 10:14

"Therefore, my beloved, flee from idolatry".

- Instead of "celebrating Christmas" we should rather know and appreciate the deep meaning and significance of the birth of Jesus Christ, the Son of God
- To celebrate Christmas is to associate the Lord's holy name with the customs and the rituals of paganism and also defile yourself
- We should honour the Lord according to the pure word of God and leave idolatrous practices to the pagans.
