IN HIS DEATH

7 - Offering Himself as a Propitiation for Our Sins

♣ GOD BREATHED (2 Tim 3:16):

- 1John 2:2 And He Himself is the propitiation for our sins, and not for ours only but also for *those of* the whole world.
- 1John 4:10 Herein is love, not that we have loved God but that He loved us and sent His Son as a propitiation for our sins.
- Heb. 2:17 Hence He should have been made like His brothers in all things that He might become a merciful and faithful High Priest in the things pertaining to God, to make propitiation for the sins of the people.
- Heb. 9:28 So Christ also, having been offered once to bear the sins of many, will appear a second time to those who eagerly await Him, apart from sin, unto salvation.

↓ THE EXCELLENCY OF THE KNOWLEDGE OF CHRIST (Phil. 3:8):

First John 2:2 says that Christ is a propitiation concerning our sins, and 4:10 says that God sent His Son a propitiation concerning our sins.

The Greek word for "propitiation" in these verses, hilasmos,

- means "that which propitiates,"
- it indicates that the Lord Jesus is the propitiatory sacrifice for our sins
- Christ offered Himself to God as a sacrifice for our sins (Heb. 9:28),
 - o not only for our redemption
 - o but also for God's satisfaction

Hence, Christ is the propitiation between God and us.

➤ Hebrews 2:17 reveals that Christ has made propitiation for our sins.

Here the Greek word rendered is **hilaskomai**,

- means "to make propitiation"
- which means to appease,
- to reconcile one by satisfying the other's demands, that is to propitiate

Hence, in Hebrews 2:17 the Lord Jesus makes propitiation for our sins to reconcile us to God by satisfying God's righteous demands on us.

SPEAK TO THE PEOPLE ALL THE WORDS OF THIS LIFE (Act 5:20):

- Through His vicarious death and in Him as our **Substitute** [hilasmos], God is satisfied and appeased.
- Through His work on the cross Christ made **propitiation** [hilaskomai] for our sins. This means that He **appeased** God for us. By appeasing God's righteousness and all His requirements on us, Christ has settled every problem between us and God.
