↓ IN THE BEGINNING WAS THE WORD (John 1:1)

- 1Cor. 15:20 But now Christ has been raised from the dead, the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep.
- 1Cor. 15:23 But each one in his own order: the firstfruits, Christ; then those who are Christ's at His coming;
- Col. 1:18 And He is the Head of the Body, the church; He is the beginning, the Firstborn from the dead, that He Himself might have the first place in all things;

LET US OFFER UP A SACRIFICE OF PRAISE CONTINUALLY TO GOD (Heb. 13:15)

❖ In resurrection Christ is the Firstfruit of resurrection.

- > Christ is set forth as the Firstfruit of resurrection.
- > Christ was the first one raised from among the dead as the firstfruit of resurrection.
 - this was typified by the firstfruits in Leviticus 23:10 and 11,
 - that was offered to God on the day after the Sabbath, the day of resurrection (Matt. 28:1)

As the Firstfruit of resurrection, Christ is the Firstborn from among the dead.

- > Christ being "the Firstborn from among the dead" is for the new creation in resurrection,
 - The new creation is the **church**, the **Body** of Christ.
- As the first in resurrection **Christ** is the **Head** of the Body.
 - He is the One who has the first place, the preeminence, in the church.

↓ WITH ONE ACCORD ... WITH ONE MOUTH GLORIFY THE GOD (Rom. 15:6)

- ♣ Christ was the first One raised from among the dead, becoming the firstfruits of resurrection. This was typified by a sheaf of the firstfruits, in Lev. 23:10-11, which were offered to God on the day after the Sabbath.
- Left Christ as the firstfruits of resurrection is the Firstborn from among the dead that He might be the Head of the Body. Since He, the Head of the Body, has been resurrected, we, the Body, also will be resurrected.
