#### **↓** IN THE BEGINNING WAS THE WORD (John 1:1)

- Rom. 1:4 Who was designated the Son of God in power according to the Spirit of holiness out of the resurrection of the dead, Jesus Christ our Lord;
- Acts 13:33 That God has fully fulfilled this *promise* to us their children in raising up Jesus, as it is also written in the second Psalm, "You are My Son; this day have I begotten You."

# **LET US OFFER UP A SACRIFICE OF PRAISE CONTINUALLY TO GOD (Heb. 13:15)**

- ❖ Before His incarnation and resurrection, Christ already was the **Son of God** 
  - > Christ was already the Son of God in His divinity
    - He did not have human nature
- ❖ In resurrection Christ is the Son of God **designated** in power (Romans 1:4).
  - First He passed through the process of incarnation to become flesh.
    - By incarnation He had put on an element, the human nature.
    - His divine nature was concealed by the flesh.
  - Then He passed through the process of death and resurrection.
    - Of this process He was designated the **Son of God** out of resurrection.
      - o that part of Him which was Jesus with the human nature, was not the Son of God
      - o by His resurrection Christ sanctified and uplifted His human nature, His humanity
      - o in this sense He was begotten the **Son of God** in His resurrection (Acts 13:33; Heb. 1:5)
    - Therefore, resurrection was Christ's designation as the Son of God.
- Christ "was designated the Son of God in power according to the Spirit of holiness..."
  - As the Son of God, Christ is constituted of the Spirit of holiness, His very element.
    - The Spirit of holiness is the life-essence within the Lord Jesus
    - Christ was designated by resurrection according to the divine life-essence in Him.

# **↓** WITH ONE ACCORD ... WITH ONE MOUTH GLORIFY THE GOD (Rom, 15:6)

- ♣ Before His incarnation Christ was the Son of God only with divinity. But now, through His resurrection,
  - ✓ He has been designated the Son of God both with divinity and humanity.
  - ✓ He was designated the Son of God with humanity in resurrection.
- 4 Christ resurrected from among the dead, He was designated in power by resurrection according to the Spirit of holiness that was in Him.
  - ✓ He is the **Son of God** in a way that is more wonderful than before,
  - ✓ He has both the divine nature and the resurrected, transformed, uplifted, glorified, and designated human nature.
