4 "ALL SCRIPTURE IS GOD-BREATHED ..." (2Tim. 3:16)

- Hos 11:1 When Israel was a child, I loved him, And out of Egypt I called My son.
- Mat 2:13 ... the Lord appeared in a dream to Joseph, saying, Arise, take the child and His mother and flee into Egypt,
- Mat 2:14 And he arose and took the child and His mother by night and departed into Egypt,

As the Newborn Christ Fleeing to Egypt and Escaping to Galilee to Dwell in Nazareth

- The prophecy of Hosea 11:1 that **Christ** would be called out of Egypt.
- ➤ Joseph received guidance in a dream to take the child **Jesus** to Egypt enabled God to fulfill the prophecy that **Christ** would be called out of Egypt.
 - The report of Christ's birth aroused the hatred and jealousy of King Herod.
 - The trouble occurred after the birth of Christ in Bethlehem, happened for Him to be taken to Egypt.
 - After Herod died, Joseph received word in another dream to return to the land of Israel (Matt. 2:19-20).
 - When Joseph returned, he was afraid to remain in the territory around Bethlehem (Matt. 2:22-23).
 - "Being warned in a dream, he departed into the parts of Galilee,
 - ...and dwelt in a city called Nazareth,
 - o that what was spoken through the prophets might be fulfilled, He shall be called a Nazarene"

❖ Root out of a Dry Ground, Having No Form nor Comeliness

- ➤ Isaiah 53:2 prophesied that,
 - "He shall grow up before him as a tender plant, and as a root out of a dry ground:
 - *he hath no form nor comeliness*;
 - and when we shall see him, there is no beauty that we should desire him."
- This word is fulfilled in 2 Corinthians 8:9b and Matthew 13:55-57.
 - In the Gospels we see that **Christ** grew up like a tender plant and as a root out of dry ground.
 - He was raised in the home of a poor carpenter in the despised town of Nazareth and in the despised province of Galilee.

↓ "FOR YOU CAN ALL PROPHESY ONE BY ONE ..." (1 Cor. 14:31)

- **♣** The Lord's human living began with suffering.
 - ✓ Shortly after He was born, it was necessary for Him to escape to Egypt. In this way He became a refugee.
 - ✓ After fleeing to Egypt, He was brought back to the land of Israel.
 - ✓ However, because it was not safe to stay in Bethlehem, He was taken to Galilee, to the despised city of Nazareth, where He grew up in a poor family as a root out of dry ground.
 - ✓ Although He was the God-man, having divinity and humanity, He grew up in a poor family and had no form or comeliness that He should be desired.
