"...THE WORDS WHICH I HAVE SPOKEN TO YOU ARE SPIRIT AND ARE LIFE" (John 6:63)

[Prophecy]

- Psa. 69:21 But they gave me gall for my food, And for my thirst they gave me vinegar to drink.
- Isa 53:12 ...Because He poured out His life unto death And was numbered with the transgressors, Yet He alone bore the sin of many And interceded for the transgressors.

[Fulfillment]

- Matt. 27:34 They gave Him wine to drink, mingled with gall. And when He tasted it, He would not drink.
- Joh 19:28 After this, Jesus, knowing that all things had now been finished *and* so that the Scripture might be fulfilled, said, I thirst.
- Joh 19:29 There was lying *there* a vessel full of vinegar; therefore, they put a sponge full of vinegar on hyssop and brought it to His mouth.
- Joh 19:30 Then when Jesus had taken the vinegar, He said, It is finished! And He bowed His head and delivered up His spirit.
- Phil. 2:8 And being found in fashion as a man, He humbled Himself, becoming obedient even unto death, and *that* the death of a cross.

"...TO REVEAL HIS SON IN ME..." (Gal. 1:16a)

- ❖ Christ is The One to Whom Gall Was Given, and Vinegar Also
 - > Psalm 69:21 is a prophecy that Christ would be the One to whom gall and vinegar would be given.
 - ➤ It was fulfilled in Matthew 27:34 which says,
 - "They gave Him wine to drink mingled with gall; and having tasted it, He would not drink."
 - At the beginning of His crucifixion, the wine mingled with gall and myrrh was offered to the Lord as a stupefying drought, which He would not drink.
 - At the end of His crucifixion, when He was thirsty, vinegar was offered to Him in a mocking way (Luke 23:36), and He took it.
 - Thirst is a taste of death (Luke 16:24; Rev. 21:8),
 - the Lord Jesus suffered it for us on the cross (Heb. 2:9)
- **Christ** is The One Who Poured Out His Soul unto Death
 - ➤ Isaiah 53:12 prophesied that Christ would be the One who poured out His soul unto death.
 - This was fulfilled in Philippians 2:8b says that Christ was "obedient even unto death, and that the death of a cross."
 - In His crucifixion Christ suffered to such an extent that He poured out His entire being, unto death.

"...LET ALL THE PEOPLES SPEAK PRAISE TO HIM ..." (Rom. 15:11)

In His crucifixion **Christ** suffered to such an extent that He poured out His soul unto death. He finished the work of His all-inclusive death, by which He accomplished redemption, terminated the old creation, and released His resurrection life to bring forth the new creation to fulfill God's purpose.
