O 17. The Tabernacle with All the Furniture

[The Tabernacle, the Showbread Table, the Lampstand, the Incense Altar, and the Ark]

a. The Tabernacle

♣ "In my heart I have treasured up Your word..." (Psa. 119:11)

Exo. 25:8 - And let them make a sanctuary for Me that I may dwell in their midst;

Exo. 25:9 - According to all that I show you, the pattern of the tabernacle and the pattern of all its furnishings,...

[Fulfillment]

John 1:14 - And the **Word** became flesh and tabernacled among us ..., full of grace and reality.

4 "...For the earth will be filled with the knowledge of Jehovah, ..." (Isa. 11:9)

- **Christ** is typified by the tabernacle with all the furniture.
 - Let them make me a sanctuary; that I may dwell among them." Exo. 25:8
 - This sanctuary was the tabernacle, which signifies God's dwelling place.
 - In the Old Testament God was in the tabernacle,
 - o for the tabernacle brought God to the children of Israel.
 - This dwelling place was not only for living but also for enjoyment.
 - > "The Word became flesh and tabernacled among us." John 1:14
 - Christ, the incarnated Word, and became God's dwelling place.
 - In the New Testament Christ in the flesh, is the real tabernacle,
 - o the tabernacle that brought God to man so that man might enjoy Him.
 - God became a man in Christ, mingled Himself with humanity, for our enjoyment.

4 "And having gift that differ..., let us prophesy according to the proportion of faith;" (Rom. 12:6)

- ♣ God's dwelling place is the place for Him to be our enjoyment, the place where we may participate in the full enjoyment of God Himself. The Old Testament tabernacle was a type, of the real tabernacle, which was Christ Himself in the flesh. He was the tabernacle of God among men.
- **Christ**, the incarnated **Word**, is a tabernacle, signifies the Word becoming flesh as **God's** expression. The **Word** took on human nature.
 - ✓ Humanity is typified by the acacia wood of the tabernacle (Exo. 26:15, 26).
 - ✓ The shining gold signify the divine nature of Christ.

Christ is God's embodiment—the Father, the Son, and the Spirit—

- ✓ was embodied in the tabernacle, and this embodiment was God's dwelling among men
- ✓ was embodied in the tabernacle, so that we may enter into God and enjoy Him.
