19. Aaron

↓ "In my heart I have treasured up Your word..." (Psa. 119:11)

[Type/Figure]

Exo. 28:3 - ... make Aaron's garments to sanctify him, that he may serve Me as a priest.

[Fulfillment]

Heb. 5:4 - And no one takes the honor upon himself, but *only* as he is called by God, just as **Aaron** also was.

Heb. 5:5 - So also **Christ** did not glorify Himself in becoming a High Priest, ...

"...For the earth will be filled with the knowledge of Jehovah, ..." (Isa. 11:9)

- ♦ Aaron is a type of **Christ** as the **High Priest** (Exo. 28:3; Heb. 5:4-5).
 - This aspect of Christ's priesthood, the **Aaronic priesthood**, is mainly for the forgiveness of sins.

•	was called and established by God to be the high priest (Heb. 5:4, 1)	• was ordained by God becoming a High Priest (Heb. 5:5)
•	as the high priest, took care of things pertaining to God on behalf of the people	• a High Priest but, having been chosen as a man to go to God with the needs of man
•	was established in honor to be the high priest only for his lifetime, for he was prevented by death from continuing	 was ordained in glory to be our High Priest forever. With Him there is no preventing of death
•	Aaron bore the names of the twelve tribes of Israel on his shoulders and on his heart (Exo. 28:9-10, 12, 21, 29)	 Today, as the High Priest in reality, Christ is in the heavens bearing us and holding us before God
•	In type , Aaron offered both gifts and sacrifices for the people and himself (Heb. 5:1, 3)	• In reality, Christ offered Himself as the sacrifice for sins

- **Christ** is superior to Aaron in taking care of all of our cases before God.
 - [On the cross] He offered Himself to God for our sins (Heb. 7:27; 9:14, 26; 10:10, 12),
 - He made propitiation for our sins (Heb. 2:17),
 - He made purification for our sins, after which He "sat down on the right hand of the Majesty on high" (Heb. 1:3).

4 "And having gift that differ..., let us prophesy according to the proportion of faith;" (Rom. 12:6)

Christ did not glorify Himself to become a **High Priest** but was ordained by God, having been chosen as a man to go to God with the needs of man. Christ is superior to Aaron in taking care of all of our cases before **God**. In type, Aaron offered both gifts and sacrifices for the people and himself, but, in reality, Christ offered Himself as the sacrifice for sins.
