46. CHRIST IN HIS PERSON (26) – In the Parables of the New Testament

P - 6. New Wine Not Able to Be Contained in the Old Wineskin

"So that what was spoken through the prophet [Psa. 78:2] might be fulfilled, saying, 'I will open My mouth in parables; I will utter things hidden from the foundation of the world'." (Matt 13:35)

[Parable – Being **incompatible** with religion]

Matt. 9:17 - Neither do they put new wine into old wineskins; otherwise, the wineskins burst, and the wine pours out, and the wineskins are ruined; but they put new wine into fresh wineskins, and both are preserved.

- # "...Why do You speak in parables to them? (Mat 13:10)
 - "...And His disciples came to H.im, saying, Make the parable ... clear to us. (Matt. 13:36)
- The new wine signifies **Christ** as the new life, full of vigor (Matt 9:17).
 - As the **new wine**, Christ is our **content**, the provision for our inward thirst.
 - When we receive His life, it stirs us up, excite us, energize us, and make us happy.
 - o His life is full of vigor and cheering strength, stirring us to excitement and satisfying us.
 - This new life excites us inwardly for the enjoyment of Him as our Bridegroom.
 - The Old wineskins signify religious forms, rituals, and practices,
 - The Lord Jesus said that we should not put new wine into old wineskins.
 - To put new wine into old wineskins is to put Christ as the exciting life into any kind of religion.
 - We should not attempt to squeeze Christ into different modes of religious ritual and formality.
 - We should never try to put the wine of Christ's life into the wineskin of old religious practices.
 - The new wine of Christ as life requires a new wineskin.
 - We must put the new wine into fresh wineskins.
 - The **fresh wineskins** signify the church life, the outward container that holds the new wine.
 - The churches are the outward containers that hold the new wine, which is Christ Himself as the exciting life.
- **4** "And having the same spirit of faith according to that which is written, "I believed, therefore I spoke," we also believe, therefore we also speak," (2Cor. 4:13)
- The kingly Savior is not only the **Bridegroom** to us for our enjoyment but also our **new garment** for us to be equipped outwardly that we may be qualified to attend the wedding. Furthermore, He is our **new life** to stir us up inwardly to enjoy Him as our Bridegroom. To enjoy Him as the Bridegroom in the kingdom feast, we need Him as our **new garment** outwardly and our **new wine** inwardly.
- The individual **Christ** is the new wine, the inward exciting life, and the corporate **Christ** is the fresh wineskin. For us it is not a matter of fasting or any other religious practice, but a matter of the church life with **Christ** as our content.
 - ✓ Christ came to establish not an earthly religion of rituals but a heavenly kingdom of life.
 - ✓ He is establishing such a kingdom not with any dead religious practices but with Himself, as the Savior, the Physician, the Bridegroom, the unfulled cloth, and the new wine for our full enjoyment, that we may be the fresh wineskin to contain Him and may become the constituents of His kingdom.
