P - 13. The Merchant in the Parable of Pearl-finding

4 "So that what was spoken through the prophet [Psa. 78:2] might be fulfilled, saying, 'I will open My mouth in parables; I will utter things hidden from the foundation of the world'." (Matt 13:35)

[Parable – The **church produced** out of the Satan-corrupted world]

Mat 13:45 - Again, the kingdom of the heavens is like a merchant seeking fine pearls;

Mat 13:46 - And finding one pearl of great value, he went and sold all that he had and bought it [the pearl].

- **4** "...He taught them many things in parables... (Mark 4:2)
 - "...Why do You speak in parables to them? (Mat 13:10)
 - "...And His disciples came to Him, saying, Make the parable ... clear to us. (Matt. 13:36)
- **Christ** is the **merchant** seeking fine **pearl** for His kingdom (Matt.13:45-46).
 - > Christ's work in gaining the one pearl of great value.
 - The **pearl**, produced in the death waters (the world filled with death)
 - by the living **oyster** (*the living Christ*),
 - wounded by a little rock (the sinner)
 - and secreting its life-juice around the wounding rock (the believer),
 - is also the material for the building of the **New Jerusalem**.
 - Every gate of the New Jerusalem is a pearl
 - o signifying the entrance into the kingdom of God
 - The **pearl** comes out of the sea,
 - The sea signifies the world corrupted by Satan (Isa. 57:20; Rev. 17:15),
 - The pearl refers to the church.
 - which is constituted mainly of regenerated believers
 - o after wounding Christ, the living oyster, we stayed at the cross, remaining at His wound.
 - o then His resurrection life was secreted, covering us again and again,
 - o and made us the pearl, the church.
- 4 "And having the same spirit of faith according to that which is written, "I believed, therefore I spoke," we also believe, therefore we also speak," (2Cor. 4:13)
- **← Christ** is the **merchant** seeking the fine **pearl**, the church for His kingdom. He found one pearl of great value, He went to the cross and sold all He had, and bought the **pearl** (not the sea). The **pearl** is precious, and the price paid for it was great. The Lord Jesus paid the price, selling all that He had to buy the **church**. According to Acts 20:28, He purchased the church with His own blood.
- **Christ** is the oyster and we are the sand that wound Him, and after injuring Him, stay at His wound His life secretes His life essence, enveloping us layer upon layer, eventually we become a pearl, this is the experience of regeneration. The life juice of Christ enveloped our being signifying our entrance into the kingdom of **God**.
