# 47. CHRIST IN HIS PERSON (27) – In the Parables of the New Testament

# P - 14. The Bread and the Crumbs in the Parable of the Children's Bread

## **Hymns:** Christ is the Tree of Life, # 1143 / # 1110 / # 17

**So that what was spoken through the prophet** [Psa. 78:2] might be fulfilled, saying, 'I will open My mouth in parables; I will utter things hidden from the foundation of the world'." (Matt 13:35)

[Parable – The **faith** of a Gentile woman]

- Matt. 15:22 And behold, a Canaanite woman ... cried out, saying, Have mercy on me, Lord, Son of David! ...
- Matt. 15:24 But He answered and said, I was not sent except to the lost sheep of the house of Israel.
- Matt. 15:25 But she came and worshipped Him, saying, Lord, help me!
- Matt. 15:26 But He answered and said, It is not good to take the children's bread and throw it to the little dogs.
- Matt. 15:27 And she said, Yes, Lord, for even the little dogs eat of the crumbs which fall from their masters' table.
- **4** "...He taught them many things in parables... (Mark 4:2)
  - "...Why do You speak in parables to them? (Mat 13:10)
  - "...And His disciples came to Him, saying, Make the parable ... clear to us. (Matt. 13:36)
- ❖ Christ reveals Himself as the children's bread, to the house of Israel
  - A Canaanite woman cried out saying, "Have mercy on me, Lord, Son of David;" (Matt. 15:22).
    - The woman considered the Lord, the **Son of David**.
    - The Lord told her that He was sent to the lost sheep of the house of Israel" (v. 24).
    - The woman, realizing that she was **not** a child of Israel, she said, "Lord, help me!" (v. 25).
    - The Lord answered, it is not good to take the children's bread and throw it to the little dogs.
      - The "children" are the Jews, and
      - the little "dogs" are the Gentiles.
    - The Lord unveiled Himself to her as small pieces of bread, good for food.
      - o The Lord referred her to the matter of eating in order to show her that she needs inward nourishing.
      - The Lord caused her to realize
        - that He was bread for the feeding of the hungry children,
        - that He was dispensing Himself to others as their inner life supply.
- **Christ**, became **crumbs** under the table as a portion to the **Gentiles**.
  - The Lord Jesus referred to the woman as a little dog.
  - The woman answered, even the dogs eat of the crumbs which fall from their masters' table (v. 27).
    - o at that time Christ, after being rejected by Jews, became "crumbs" under the table as portion to the Gentiles.
- **4** "And having the same spirit of faith according to that which is written, "I believed, therefore I spoke," we also believe, therefore we also speak," (2Cor. 4:13)
- The holy land of Israel was the table on which Christ, the heavenly bread, came as a portion to the children of Israel. but they threw Him off the table to the "ground," the Gentile country. He became broken crumbs as a portion to the Gentiles. We need to realize that Christ has been cast off the table by the Israelites and is now in the Gentile world, where the dogs are. As the crumbs under the table, the edible Christ is near to us.
- Feeding is a matter of dispensing. Christ dispensing Himself as bread, as nourishing food, as the element of the life supply, to satisfy us. We need to take Christ in by eating Him as bread, even as the crumbs under the table.

## **Christ is the Tree of Life**

In the beginning we can see
God placed man in front
of two different trees—
The tree of life and
the tree of knowledge

One leads to life by eating Him.
