48. CHRIST IN HIS PERSON (28) – In the Parables of the New Testament

P-27. The Lord in the Parables of Watching P-28. The Vinedresser in the Parable of the Unfruitful Fig Tree

♣ "So that what was spoken through the prophet [Psa. 78:2] might be fulfilled, saying, 'I will open My mouth in parables; I will utter things hidden from the foundation of the world'." (Matt 13:35)

[Parable – Teaching to be **watchful** and faithful]

- Luke 12:36 And you be like men waiting for their own master when he returns from the wedding feast, so that when he comes and knocks they may open to him immediately.
- Luke 12:37 Blessed are those slaves whom the master, when he comes, will find watching. ...
- Luke 12:43 Blessed is that slave whom his master, when he comes, will find so doing.

[Parable - Teaching concerning **repentance**]

- Luke 13:6 A certain man had a fig tree planted in his vineyard. And he came seeking fruit on it and did not find any.
- Luke 13:7 And he said to the vinedresser, Behold, ... I have come seeking fruit on this fig tree, and I have not found *any*. Cut it down therefore. Why does it also make the ground useless?
- Luke 13:8 But he answered and said to him, Master, leave ..., until I dig around it and throw on manure.
- Luke 13:9 And if it produces fruit in the future, *good*; otherwise, cut it down.
- **4** "...He taught them many things in parables... (Mark 4:2)
 - "...Why do You speak in parables to them? (Mat 13:10)
 - "...And His disciples came to Him, saying, Make the parable ... clear to us. (Matt. 13:36)
- **Christ**, as the householder who will come back to be with us who are watchful (Luke 12:35-48).
 - He will reward us according to how we been watching.
- **Christ** is the vinedresser in the parable of the unfruitful fig tree (Luke 13:6-9).
 - God as the owner of the vineyard came in the Son to the Jewish people as to a fig tree (Matt. 21:19; Jer. 24:2, 5, 8).
 - The fig tree was planted in God's promised land as the vineyard (Matt. 21:33)
 - o God the Father as the certain man seeks fruit from them, and He did not find any.
 - He wanted to cut them down, but the **Son** as the vinedresser prayed for them
 - that **God the Father** would tolerate them
 - until the **Son** died for them (*dug the ground around the fig tree*)
 - and gave them fertilizer (threw on manure),
 - hoping that they would then **repent** and produce fruit.
 - But the Jews did not repent, even after the Lord Jesus died and resurrected and the Spirit came,
 - o the "fig tree" was "cut down."
 - o This happened in A.D. 70 when Titus brought his Roman army to Jerusalem and destroyed the city.
- **♣** "And having the same spirit of faith according to that which is written, "I believed, therefore I spoke," we also believe, therefore we also speak," (2Cor. 4:13)
- We should be ready and be watchful, because at an hour when we do not expect *it*, the **Son of Man** is coming. As slaves we need to be watchful and faithful. Blessed are we whom our master, when he comes, will find us so doing. He will set us over all His possessions.
- Let us be watchful and faithful in carrying out the Lord's commission. Otherwise, when the Lord comes back, He will find us not watching and not faithful. Then we shall lose the enjoyment of the jubilee in the coming age of the kingdom.
