[The New Covenant - 2. The Shedder of the Better Blood]

- Heb. 8:6 ... He has obtained a more excellent ministry inasmuch as He is also the Mediator of a better covenant, which has been enacted upon better promises.
- Heb. 8:10 For this is the covenant which I will covenant ..., says the Lord:
 I will impart My laws into their mind, and on their hearts I will inscribe them;
 and I will be God to them, and they will be a people to Me.
- Heb. 9:15 And because of this He is the Mediator of a new covenant, so that, ..., those who have been called might receive the promise of the eternal inheritance.
- **Until** we all arrive at the oneness of the faith and of the full knowledge of the Son of God, ..." (Eph. 4:13)
- ❖ In the new covenant **Christ** is also the Mediator (Hebrews 8:6).
 - As the Mediator Christ goes between us and God.
 - By His death Christ consummated the new covenant.
 - o The promise of the eternal inheritance is based on Christ's eternal redemption
 - In resurrection He executes the new covenant,
 - o which He bequeathed to us by His death.
 - o it not only enacted upon better promises of a better law, the inner law of life (Heb. 8:10-12),
 - o but also was consummated with Christ's better sacrifices (Heb. 9:23),
 - which accomplished for us an eternal redemption (9:12),
 - and the better blood of Christ, which purifies our conscience (9:14).

"But he who prophesies speaks building up and encouragement and consolation to men.," (1Cor, 14:3)

♣ By His death Christ consummated the new covenant. In His death He left this new covenant with us, and now in His resurrection He, as the Mediator of the new covenant, is executing what has been accomplished in the new covenant. All the promises of God have become accomplished facts in the new covenant due to Christ's redemptive work. As the Mediator of the new covenant, Christ today in resurrection is enforcing this covenant that we might receive the eternal inheritance.
