10. Sanctification

Your words were found and I ate them, And Your word became to me The gladness and joy of my heart," (Jer. 15:16)

1Cor. 1:30 - But of **Him** you are **in Christ Jesus**, who became wisdom to us from **God**: both righteousness (*Rom. 5:18*) and sanctification (*Rom. 6:19, 22*) and redemption (*Rom. 8:23*),

Until we all arrive at the oneness of the faith and of the full knowledge of the Son of God, ..." (Eph. 4:13)

- **Christ** is not only our **Sanctifier**; He Himself is our sanctification (1 Cor. 1:30).
 - Christ is the element that produces transformation.
 - He is the element that, when added to our being, produces a metabolic change.
 - Whereas the **crucified Christ** was for our justification,
 - the **resurrected Christ** is for our sanctification.
 - As the life-giving Spirit in our spirit,
 - Christ lives within us for our sanctification.
 - He is our life, and He is saturating our being with His holy nature
 - until we are thoroughly sanctified dispositionally.

> Christ is our sanctification

- not only positional by the Lord's blood
- but also dispositional by the divine life, even by the living Christ Himself.
- The Lord is now working within our spirit,
 - spreading Himself from the center of our being throughout every part of us until He reaches the circumference.
 - Then we shall be completely saturated with His holy nature.
- Separation, or objective sanctification, can take place rather easily and in a very short time.
- But it takes a long time for us to be sanctified dispositionally.
 - we should remain under the dispensing of the Triune God,
 - o experiencing Christ as our dispositional sanctification,
 - then we shall daily be saturated with the divine nature until we are thoroughly transformed in mind, emotion, and will.

"But he who prophesies speaks building up and encouragement and consolation to men.," (1Cor. 14:3)

- **♣** Sanctification of the Spirit consists of three steps:
 - (1) the Spirit's seeking us and convicting us at the time that He caused us to repent and believe (1 Pet. 1:2; John 16:8);
 - (2) His sanctifying us both positionally and dispositionally (Heb. 13:12; 1 Cor. 6:11) at the time we were saved; and
 - (3) His sanctifying us dispositionally as we pursue the growth in life (Rom. 6:19, 22).
- God's salvation is applied to us that we may obtain and enjoy it fully. The three steps of the Spirit's sanctification not only separate us from all old and negative things, making us holy unto God, but also sanctify us, making us a new creation full of the Lord's essence and element, that we may obtain the Lord's glory.

John 3:14 -

And as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the **Son of Man** be lifted up,

(In one aspect,

the Lord's death was His **falling** into the ground, as revealed in v. 24; in another aspect,

it was His being **lifted up** on the tree (1 Pet. 2:24).

- * His falling into the ground was to **produce** the **many grains**;
- * His being lifted up on the tree was to **draw all men** to Himself.

The many grains **produced** by His **falling** into the ground are the "all men" **drawn** by His being **lifted up** on the tree.)

1Pet. 2:24 -

Who Himself bore up our sins in His body on the tree, in order that we, having died to sins, might live to righteousness; by whose bruise you were healed.
