## **Life-Study of Exodus Summaries – Messages 56-60**

## MESSAGE 56-57 - How the Old Testament Seekers of God Enjoyed His Law

Those who enjoyed God's law in the Old Testament were seekers of God. Psalm 119:132 indicates that the psalmist loved the Lord's name and remembered His name. If we are those who seek God, we will remember His name. We should seek the Lord in an intimate way, entreating His countenance, even asking Him to cause His face to shine upon us. If the Lord's face shines upon us, we shall automatically walk in His presence. The psalmist also refers to the law of God as God's word. This proves that he thought of God's law as His living word. If we contact the Lord in our spirit as we read the Bible, the Word will become spirit and life to us. Taking God's law to be His word, the psalmist believed, chose, lifted up their hand, loved, delighted, tasted, rejoiced in, sang of, respected, had a sound heart, inclined their heart, sought, longed for, hoped in, and trusted in it. The psalmist also mused upon, considered, esteemed it right, entered into, learned, treasured, hid in their heart, remembered, stood in awe, cleaved to, turned their feet unto, kept, observed, practiced, walked and ran to it. May we enjoy the Word of God more by musing upon it. In this way, our enjoyment becomes spontaneous and increases. Praise the Lord! (Life-Study of Exodus, 56–57).

MESSAGE 58 – The Function of God's Law as His Living Word to His Loving Seekers
If we would know how God's law functions as His living word, we must consider the law not only as regulations and commandments given by God, but even more as the word out of God's mouth, the very breath of God. The function of the law as the living word of God is actually the function or operation of God Himself. As God's living word, the law gives man light. Again and again, we need to come to the Word for the purpose of receiving nourishment and refreshment. Another function of the Word of God is to restore man's soul and rejoice man's heart. It also brings us salvation every moment. It strengthens and comforts us. It upholds us, keeps us safe, and causes hope and causes us to enjoy God as our portion, and enjoy His countenance. Through the Word we may enjoy God as our hiding place and shield and also enjoy God's help and well-dealing. We should not only read the Bible, but also pray, sing, and psalm the Bible and even give thanks to God with the words of the Bible. (Life-Study of Exodus, 58).

## MESSAGE 59-60 – The Blessing Received by the Loving Seekers of God Through His Law as His Living Word

The Word of God contains all that God is. This is the reason the Word of God is so rich, substantial, living, and enlightening. All that God can be to us, the Word can be also. Provided we have no problems within us which cause a hindrance, we should receive blessing whenever we come to the Word of God. If we fail to receive help when we come to the Word, there is a problem of some kind in our heart. Although we may read the Word of God, perhaps out of a sense of duty, we may not have a heart for the Word. Another problem you may have in your heart is the problem of a divided heart. It is not profitable to read the Word of God in a halfhearted way. There may also be hindrances or frustrations within us. If we want to receive blessing from the Word of God, we must first deal with our heart and turn to the Lord absolutely and with our whole heart. The Bible demands that we humble ourselves and put aside our selfconfidence and self-assurance. If we have a humble attitude when we come to the Word, not having any trust in ourselves, we shall be enlightened. The loving seekers of God also receive the life supply, the enlivening, the quickening, through His living Word. This life supply we receive causes us to be watered. These blessings will lead us to the highest blessing of all - the **enjoyment of God Himself as our portion**. May we have a proper approach to the Word of God that issues in all the blessings. When we enjoy God Himself as our portion, we shall have knowledge, wisdom, understanding, and discernment; we shall be preserved from every evil way; we shall be established; and we shall be **overcomers**, those who are above every negative thing.
